9	an amendment to Council's upcoming meeting
10	schedule was suggested by Daryl Revoldt,
11	chairman of Council's community and economic
12	development committee.
13	Mr. Revoldt wished to add a Special
14	Council meeting to the agenda for Monday, May
15	3rd, 2021, to allow for a third reading of
16	Ordinance Number 28-21, North Canton's
17	Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area, commonly
18	referred to as DORA, with the legislation to
19	be passed on emergency.
20	The amended meeting schedule suggested by
21	Councilman Revoldt at 1:29:50 into last
22	week's two-hour meeting was subsequently
23	voted on and approved by all members of
24	Council.
25	On midday Friday, April 30th, 2021, four

days after Council voted to schedule a vote on the DORA legislation for tonight's meeting, I was surprised to read online in The Repository that the DORA legislation had been voted on at a Special Council meeting held earlier that day, Friday morning, at 8:00 a.m. -- 8:00 a.m.

Are public announcements of Council's upcoming meeting schedule to be believed or trusted? What was the rush to enact the DORA legislation? Why couldn't this DORA legislation wait 72 hours and be voted on Monday, May 3rd, 2021 as announced and agreed to by the entire Council membership? Is someone at City Hall so in need of a beer to stroll along Main Street that they cannot wait 24 -- 72 hours?

Why can't citizens trust or believe the information that comes from North Canton City Hall?

At an hour and 14 minutes into the meeting, Council's community and economic committee chairman reported that ground breaking on the Diebold warehouse had taken place. This is yet another announcement that

cannot be believed. What in fact is happening across the street at the former Hoover Company property is mitigation of the contamination that exists where the expansion of the warehouse is to take place in the future.

For the last six weeks, vast quantities of contaminated soil have been excavated from Hoover and transported by trucks to a landville -- fill in Belleville, Michigan in an effort to clean up high levels of contamination.

A March 25th, '21 report from the Hall and Associates project manager to region 5 of the EPA states, and I quote, specifically the cleanup plan addresses a portion of the north yard defined as the remediation area. The investigation and cleanup of PCBs described herein is a continuation of prior remediation efforts within the north yard by CH2M Hill on behalf of the Hoover Company, and is being implemented as an interim corrective measure, as executed by the USEPA at Maple Street on May 24, 2016.

Anyone who is monitoring the nearly two

months of efforts to minimize the contamination can see this is not a ground breaking for construction. These mitigation efforts may last another two months. It is unnerving to this day that City officials seriously considered building a safety center on this very site a short two years ago when Stuart Lichter made a self-serving offer to donate property to the City for the safety center.

Lastly, Council Member Mark Cerreta remarked that owner of Pav's was in support of the DORA. What does that mean? Will Pav's be purchasing thousands of DORA -- official DORA cups from the City at inflated costs, so the City can recoup the expense of \$9,000 for the required trash containers?

As I see it playing out, of the four required liquor operators in North Canton's DORA, there will only be one liquor operator purchasing official DORA cups in lots of 500 each, at one dollar or more per cup. El Rincon has told -- repeatedly told me they have no interest in the DORA. Pav's has told me that the 16-ounce DORA cups are not

1 suitable to hold the alcoholic shakes they 2 Sapphire Board Game, in my 3 estimation, does not have the financial 4 wherewithal to expend \$500 at a time for 5 official DORA sippy cups, nor will the public 6 have any desire in climbing 20 steps to their 7 second floor game room, only to navigate back 8 down the long stairs to go outside to drink 9 from their official DORA cup. 10 Lastly, the Howlin -- Howlin Bird has an 11 extensive outdoor patio. Why would the 12 public want to pay a higher price for their 13 drink when they can enjoy their beverage 14 sitting on Howlin Bird's outdoor patio? 15 idea of a DORA in North Canton has led to a 16 waste of thousands of citizen tax dollars. 17 Thank you. 18 MR. REVOLDT: Thank you. 19 MR. FONTE: Thank you. 20 MR. REVOLDT: All right. Let's move on 21 to new business. Item 6A, an ordinance for 22 the designation of projects for the use of 23 the ARPA funds. Administration, do you

MR. REVOLDT: Patrick.

MR. DEORIO: Yes. Thank you. So this is the parcel in the block that we were trying to acquire in order to at some point be considering the construction of a police/fire building. Council has already authorized and we have acquired three of those four properties. This is the fourth one. So this one took a little bit longer. We had a circuitous route that it took us to court under potential eminent domain action. It led to a mediation, and then finally to an agreed settlement.

And before you is the settlement of that litigation and then the purchase of the -- of this property. So the -- the purchase price is actually \$895-, \$895,000. But we have potential associated costs with closing at that number.

As far as the overall viewpoint of, you know, what we -- we authorized -- what

Council authorized the administration to in 1 essence finance, we went to the bond market, 2 as you know, a year ago or so. We financed 3 \$2.9 million. And we have come in 4 significantly under budget on the acquisition 5 costs for these four properties. 6 So we think that this will -- once we get 7 it signed, sealed, delivered, there are a 8 number of steps of -- you know, until we get 9 to the closing date, but first thing was we 10 had -- we had ten days to get this through 11 City Council. That's why we have asked for 12 an emergency clause on this one. And then 13 from there, we'll set a closing date, and 14 that should be done within the next 45 days. 15 MR. REVOLDT: Does Council have any 16 17 questions? (No response.) 18 MR. REVOLDT: Seeing none, then may I 19 have a motion to adopt the first reading of 20 Ordinance 37-21? 21 MR.
