1 MR. YOUNG: All right. When you are
2 ready, President Peters.

3 MR. PETERS: Okay. All set. All right.
4 I'd like to call to order the North Canton
5 City Council Special Committee of the Whole
6 meeting, April 29th, 2020. The time is 5:02
7 p.m.

8 Ben, could you call the roll, please?

9 MR. YOUNG: Member Revoldt.

10 MR. REVOLDT: Here.

11 MR. YOUNG: Peters.

12 MR. PETERS: Here.

13 MR. YOUNG: Member Werren.

14 MS. WERREN: Here.

15 MR. YOUNG: Member Fonte.

16 MR. FONTE: I'm here.

17 MR. YOUNG: Member Foltz.

18 MR. FOLTZ: Here.

19 MR. YOUNG: Member Cerreta.

20 MR. CERRETA: Here.

21 MR. YOUNG: Member Stroia.

22 MR. STROIA: Here.

23 MR. YOUNG: Seven present.

24 MR. PETERS: Okay. We are all set. Only
25 one item on the agenda, Community Economic

1 Development. Chairman Revoldt, the floor is
2 yours.

3 MR. REVOLDT: Thank you very much, Mr.
4 President. Council has for its consideration
5 this evening Ordinance 24-2020. Previously,
6 Council authorized the borrowing for a public
7 purpose of \$2.9 million.

8 In tonight's ordinance, we are -- we are
9 going to ask or authorize the administration
10 to purchase a parcel of real estate located
11 at 1212 North Main Street, in an amount not
12 to exceed \$690,000, of that \$2.9 million.
13 The City has completed all the requisite
14 actions necessary for a real estate purchase,
15 and it is the City's intention to close on
16 this purchase on May 4th.

17 This would be a good opportunity just to
18 revisit. We have -- we engaged in a long
19 process to assess our -- our needs for our
20 safety forces. And Council concluded that
21 our safety forces had outgrown their three
22 separate locations.

23 In the interim, however, I would note
24 that with the advent of COVID-19, an extra
25 emphasis has been placed upon a need for

1 newer facilities, in that there is virtually
2 no social distancing at police, fire, and
3 EMS. And we are very, very fortunate that
4 none of our safety cohorts were wiped out
5 this -- during this epidemic. The design for
6 the building, should it go forward, will
7 address COVID issues, as well as general
8 biohazards.

9 Pat, I think one of the reasons we are
10 looking at the site at 1212 North Main -- for
11 those who are on streaming, it's the site of
12 the North Canton post office -- this site is
13 least problematic for residential neighbors.
14 So sirens and vehicle traffic should not be
15 an issue. And it also has a clean
16 environmental record.

17 So, Pat, what am I leaving out here?

18 MR. DEORIO: Daryl, I think you have
19 covered it very well. We have been on this
20 process for the better part of about six to
21 seven months, in negotiations and making sure
22 that we have got, you know, all the T's
23 crossed and the I's dotted. We have, you
24 know, come to that point where we need to
25 close on this and take title.

1 It's part of a series of transactions
2 that should occur in the next few weeks. But
3 the -- as you recall, the architects had put
4 together a structure that would suit our
5 needs, that would fit on a generic 3-acre
6 parcel, or series of parcels, and this is the
7 first of -- of what is necessary in that
8 area, in that block, to be able to put a
9 facility of such size.

10 MR. REVOLDT: Thank you, Pat. I'd like
11 to turn to our Vice-Chairman, Mr. Cerreta.
12 Mark, is there anything you'd like to add in
13 this matter?

14 MR. CERRETA: No. I think you -- you
15 pretty well covered it. It's something we
16 have been working on. There is an
17 opportunity here. And I give a lot of credit
18 to Pat and his group for jumping on this and
19 taking -- moving forward on this opportunity.

20 MR. REVOLDT: And I'd open it up to
21 Council. Does it have any questions or
22 comments?

23 MR. PETERS: No. I'm good, Daryl.

24 MR. FOLTZ: No. Foltz.

25 MR. WILDER: Councilman Revoldt.

1 MR. REVOLDT: Yes.

2 MR. WILDER: Can the Mayor chime in on
3 this a little bit?

4 MR. PETERS: Sure.

5 MR. REVOLDT: Are we done with Council?

6 MS. WERREN: Yep.

7 MR. REVOLDT: Okay. Mr. Mayor, the floor
8 is yours.

9 MR. WILDER: Once again, thank you very
10 much for your explanation, and -- and I think
11 that Mr. Cerreta also talked about the
12 opportunity we have. I know there has been
13 discussion on this actually for the last two
14 years. I challenged Mr. DeOrio to help me
15 work on a plan for a safety building complex
16 and campus for our safety forces.

17 And as we work towards the future in
18 providing a safer environment for our
19 employees, and also accessibility to our
20 community -- not to get into design features
21 or anything like this -- it takes an
22 emergency sometimes like even this pandemic
23 crisis that we are in to show our strengths
24 that we have, but also our weaknesses in
25 protecting our employees to the best that we

1 can.

2 My compliments go off to our two Chiefs.
3 They coordinated and jumped in very early,
4 with the administration's assistance, and
5 all -- for all our department employees to
6 protect themselves as -- with the personal
7 protection equipment as much as possible.
8 They have face masks and physical distancing
9 and remote work.

10 But getting back to the safety building,
11 I think now -- we are striking now for the
12 future. And -- and I don't want to pass up
13 on an opportunity to have significant
14 improvements in our emergency services and
15 the coordination of our services, keeping our
16 people safe, but also the people we interact
17 with safe, too.

18 So I just want to thank Council for their
19 support in this initiative. And I think it
20 will be a -- a wonderful asset as we continue
21 to re-energize our community and -- and meet
22 the needs for a good portion of our
23 employees, our safety services, because thank
24 goodness we have everybody else in our -- in
25 our departments working safely, remotely, and

1 the best that they can. But providing
2 health, safety, and welfare, that's a big
3 part of our community, and that's through our
4 safety forces.

5 So enough said about that. I just want
6 to say that I think our future is bright with
7 having the opportunity to have a safety
8 building complex, still located right here in
9 our downtown area. So thank you very much
10 for the time, for allowing me to share my
11 thoughts.

12 MR. FONTE: Mayor, it's Dominic. I've
13 got a quick question here, guys. Dom here.

14 MR. PETERS: Yes.

15 MR. FONTE: Mayor, thanks for the input,
16 and we are looking forward to working
17 together to open up the City in a safe,
18 diligently manner.

19 Hey, guys --

20 THE REPORTER: Excuse me.

21 MR. FONTE: Stephanie -- hey --

22 THE REPORTER: Excuse me.

23 MR. FONTE: -- whoever is on the call
24 that can't mute the call -- I mean, come on,
25 man. There is a lot of background noise. So

1 when you guys are on a call --

2 THE REPORTER: Yeah, it's horrible.

3 MR. FONTE: -- mute the call if you guys
4 are not talking. Okay?

5 THE REPORTER: Thank you.

6 MR. PETERS: Okay.

7 MR. FONTE: Do people not get it? Mute
8 the call if you guys are on it.

9 MR. REVOLDT: Mr. President.

10 MR. PETERS: Yes, sir.

11 MR. REVOLDT: If I could, I -- I would
12 just like to reiterate something that the
13 Mayor said. This has been a huge lift for
14 the administration. It has required a -- a
15 great time commitment. There have been a lot
16 of moving parts. And the fact that we are
17 here and we're going to very quickly adopt a
18 piece of legislation does not
19 accurately reflect -- or adequately reflect
20 the effort that Pat and his team have put
21 together on this.

22 So, Pat, I'd like the record to reflect,
23 thank you for -- for moving this first
24 critical piece forward.

25 MR. DEORIO: Thank you, Mr. Revoldt.

1 MR. REVOLDT: I'd like to move that we
2 adopt the first reading of Ordinance 24-2020.

3 MS. WERREN: So moved. Stephanie.

4 MR. PETERS: Well, we are in a Committee
5 meeting.

6 MR. REVOLDT: We are in a Committee
7 meeting. I'm sorry.

8 MS. WERREN: That's right.

9 MR. PETERS: Yeah.

10 MS. WERREN: Hey, and I -- hey, Daryl,
11 just a great point, and a shout out to Pat.
12 I know how hard he has worked. And also just
13 the acceptance of our Mayor, too. You know,
14 as a new Mayor, for you to be willing to go
15 forward with this is huge. And I just think
16 it's an amazing step in the right direction.
17 So thank you for both of you working together
18 and really pushing this forward.

19 MR. REVOLDT: I guess I misspoke.
20 Thanks, Stephanie. Is that we do want to
21 make sure that we have authorized this on an
22 emergency, so no one has any objection to
23 that. We need to do this on May 4th, by May
24 4th.

25 MS. WERREN: Yes.

1 MR. REVOLDT: So are there any other
2 issues related to this? Because we will
3 need -- we will need six.

4 MR. WILDER: May I -- point of order, if
5 I can.

6 MR. PETERS: We are going to do this
7 immediately following this meeting.

8 MR. REVOLDT: Okay.

9 MR. PETERS: Okay.

10 MR. REVOLDT: All right.

11 MR. PETERS: Mayor --

12 MR. CERRETA: Very good.

13 MR. PETERS: -- did you have something?

14 MR. WILDER: I was just going to jump
15 back. Did Dominic have a question or
16 concern?

17 MR. FONTE: No. I'm good. I -- I think
18 we are on the right track. Like I said, you
19 know, in the other meetings, you know, even
20 though there is a little hesitation here
21 because of the economy and what's going on,
22 we are taking a bold act to be able to
23 control our destiny as a City. And I think,
24 again, we don't just curse the wind when we
25 get curve balls thrown our way. We adjust

1 our sails. And as a City and as officials,
2 that's what we are trying to do, is adjust
3 our sails to be in a position so that when we
4 are on the rebound, we are there catching the
5 wind. You know what I'm saying?

6 And so, Pat, kudos to you for your hard
7 work and your dedication. Mayor, I'm looking
8 forward to continuing with you and getting
9 the City in a safe manner back opened up, so
10 people get back to their -- their daily
11 business. Okay? That's it.

12 MR. WILDER: Thank you for your -- your
13 perspective, and allowing me to share mine
14 tonight.

15 MR. REVOLDT: Okay. I'm done.

16 MR. PETERS: Okay. All right.

17 MR. FOLTZ: Adjourn the meeting.

18 MR. PETERS: I'll tell you what, we'll --
19 yeah, we'll adjourn this meeting and go right
20 into the City Council -- or Special City
21 Council meeting. So I'll entertain a motion
22 to adjourn.

23 MR. FOLTZ: Motion to adjourn.

24 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta, second.

25 MR. PETERS: All in favor, say "aye."

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MR. FOLTZ: Aye.
MR. PETERS: Aye.
MR. REVOLDT: Aye.

1 MR. PETERS: I'd like to call to order
2 the North Canton Special City Council
3 meeting, April 29th, 2020. The time is 5:14
4 p.m.

5 Mark, would you like to lead us in the
6 opening prayer?

7 MR. CERRETA: Sure would. Sure would.

8 (Whereupon, Mr. Cerreta lead us in
9 prayer.)

10 MR. PETERS: Amen. Thank you, Mark. At
11 this time, if you would all please join me in
12 reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

13 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance was
14 recited.)

15 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you,
16 folks.

17 Ben, at this time, would you please call
18 the roll?

19 MR. YOUNG: Member Foltz.

20 MR. REVOLDT: Present.

21 MR. YOUNG: Member Peters.

22 MR. PETERS: Here.

23 MR. YOUNG: Member Werren.

24 MS. WERREN: Here.

25 MR. YOUNG: Member Fonte.

1 MR. FONTE: Here.

2 MR. YOUNG: Member Revoldt.

3 MR. REVOLDT: Here.

4 MR. YOUNG: Member Cerreta.

5 MR. CERRETA: Here.

6 MR. YOUNG: And Member Stroia.

7 MR. STROIA: Here.

8 MR. YOUNG: Seven present.

9 MR. FOLTZ: Did you get Member Foltz?

10 MR. YOUNG: He was the first name I

11 called.

12 MR. FOLTZ: Okay. I thought it was

13 Revoldt. Okay. I'm here anyway.

14 MR. YOUNG: Sorry about that.

15 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you.

16 We've got seven present. At this time,

17 recognition of visitors.

18 Ben, I will turn it over to you at this

19 time. Thank you.

20 MR. YOUNG: Our only speaker tonight is

21 Mr. Osborne.

22 Mr. Osborne, are you there?

23 MR. OSBORNE: I am here.

24 MR. YOUNG: Then when you are ready.

25 MR. OSBORNE: Well, first of all, I'd

1 like to say I'm -- I'm hoping you got your --
2 everything wired together correctly. Last
3 week's meeting -- or Monday night's meeting
4 did not go well. My remarks, five people
5 have told me they couldn't hear a thing.

6 Number two, I never did hear the Finance
7 Director give her budget forecast report. I
8 don't know if that took place or not. So
9 everybody is backslapping and high-fiving
10 about how great these virtual meetings are
11 going. The first couple went very well. But
12 last week's was not the night to be jumping
13 up and patting yourself on the back. It did
14 not go well.

15 With that said, I have one other
16 suggestion. When you get to the Pledge of
17 Allegiance, there is no reason to hear seven
18 people or a whole crowd of people pledging
19 the allegiance. I would suggest that just
20 one person read it, and everybody else just
21 lip sync it to themselves, just so -- because
22 it just sounds so chaotic in this format.

23 Again, I hope that I'm being heard. I'll
24 start out with my only concern here was, with
25 the agenda that I received, that you were

1 paying \$2.9 million for this post office
2 property. Thank you, Mr. Revoldt, for
3 clarifying that in your very initial remarks.

4 I concur, \$690,000 is about -- almost
5 \$90,000 less than the currently appraised
6 value of the property by the Stark County
7 Auditor. I don't know if anybody on Council
8 has done any homework on this. I certainly
9 kind of doubt it.

10 I have certainly scoped out the other
11 three parcels that I presume the City is
12 going to go after. The savings and loan is
13 just short of an acre. That's \$632,000
14 appraisal. The Duke gas station is a half
15 acre at \$123,800, which is really overpriced.
16 It's kind of a worthless piece of property.
17 And the office complex is just under
18 \$700,000. In total, this will give the
19 safety center 4.16 acres, if anybody has,
20 again, done any cursory investigation on
21 their part.

22 I don't know how this agenda got sent out
23 with a single parcel number, indicating you
24 are going to pay \$2.9 million for it. If
25 anybody wants to explain that, or Mr. Young

1 explain that, it was quite disconcerting. I
2 don't know where this was coming from.

3 I did meet with City Administrator DeOrion
4 months and months ago at a luncheon, and I
5 encouraged him to get out there and start
6 buying some property. And I don't know if
7 that relieved him from hearing me down the
8 line speaking in opposition, but I know I
9 have encouraged this for months, and I'm glad
10 the City has come out and asked for it. I
11 hope Mr. DeOrion is realizing that these are
12 very difficult economic times. We should be
13 able to get some very, very good pricing on
14 the remaining parcels.

15 And I do have one last question. I don't
16 know if anybody has got a rough estimate. To
17 acquire all four of these parcels at their
18 currently appraised value, it's about \$2.2
19 million. So I presume the remaining -- I
20 don't know -- \$700,000 will be utilized for
21 demolition. And does anybody have an idea
22 what the demo cost of the post office
23 building is? And with that, I wholeheartedly
24 concur and I'm glad to see things moving
25 forward.

1 And, Mr. Fonte, thank you for speaking
2 up. There was a lot of background noise.
3 People should be cognizant of how to function
4 at these meetings and mute your phones when
5 you are -- you are not talking. We don't
6 need all this background noise. Thank you
7 very much.

8 MR. FONTE: Thanks for your comments.

9 MR. PETERS: Thank you, Mr. Osborne.
10 Appreciate the comments. All right. We'll
11 move into new business. And for Ordinance
12 24-20, first of all, I need a motion and a
13 second to suspend the rules of Council
14 requiring favorable Committee report for
15 Ordinance 24-20 as allowed at Rule 111.06(C).

16 MR. REVOLDT: Revoldt moves.

17 MR. FOLTZ: Foltz --

18 MR. REVOLDT: Revoldt moves.

19 MR. FOLTZ: Foltz, second.

20 MR. PETERS: Foltz, second. All in
21 favor, say "aye."

22 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

23 MR. PETERS: Aye.

24 MR. CERRETA: Aye.

25 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.

1 MS. WERREN: Aye.
2 MR. FONTE: Aye.
3 MR. STROIA: Aye.
4 MR. PETERS: Opposed?

6 MR. PETERS: All right. Motion carries.
7 At this time, may I have a motion and a
8 second to read by title only Ordinance 24-20?
9 MR. REVOLDT: Revoldt moves.
10 MR. CERRETA: Cerreta, second.
11 MS. WERREN: Werren, second.
12 MR. PETERS: All right. Cerreta, second.
13 All in favor, say "aye."
14 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.
15 MR. PETERS: Aye.
16 MR. CERRETA: Aye.
17 MR. REVOLDT: Aye.
18 MS. WERREN: Aye.
19 MR. FONTE: Aye.
20 MR. STROIA: Aye.
21 MR. PETERS: Opposed?
22 (No response.)
23 MR. PETERS: All right. Motion carries.
24 Tim, please.
25 MR. FOX: Yes, sir. An ordinance

1 authorizing the Mayor of the City of North
2 Canton, through the Board of Control, to
3 enter into an agreement for the purchase of
4 the real property located at 1212 North Main
5 Street, in the City of North Canton, Stark
6 County, Ohio, permanent parcel number
7 9205251, property, at a cost not to exceed
8 \$690,000, and declaring the same to be an
9 emergency.

10 MR. PETERS: All right. Thank you.

11 Chairman Revoldt.

12 MR. REVOLDT: I think the matter has been
13 discussed. I have nothing more to add. If
14 anyone else -- does anyone else have anything
15 to say at this time?

16 (No response.)

17 MR. REVOLDT: If not, then I move the
18 adoption of the first reading of Ordinance
19 24-2020.

20 MR. FOLTZ: Foltz, second.

21 MR. PETERS: All right. All in favor,
22 say "aye."

23 MR. FOLTZ: Aye.

21 At this time, before final call for new
22 business, I'd like to turn it over to the
23 Mayor. I believe he has something for us.
24 Mayor, the floor is yours.

25 MR. WILDER: Thank you, Mr. President,

1 and Council. Tonight, I'd like to share the
2 proclamation with one of our long-time
3 community leaders, Sandy Lang. Tonight, I'd
4 like to read to her, as I believe she is
5 listening in, this proclamation. So please
6 bear with me.

7 Whereas, Sandra Lang, having served as
8 Director of North Canton Public Library for
9 eleven years and served as a librarian for
10 four-year period prior, intends to retire on
11 April 30th, 2020.

12 Whereas, in addition to serving as
13 Director, Sandra Lang has served as President
14 of the Rotary Club of North Canton, Chair of
15 the Rotary Project 6650 four way test speech,
16 and as an active member of the Talk About
17 Potential, or cat -- or TAP group, community
18 leaders collaborating on enhancing the
19 quality of life for the Greater North Canton
20 community, and supported the many programs
21 and events for the North Canton Area Chamber
22 of Commerce.

23 Whereas, under Director Lang's
24 leadership, the North Canton Public Library
25 has continued to fulfill its mission and

1 vision of inspiring the community to seek
2 lifelong learning and enjoyment of providing
3 diverse quality programs, services, and
4 resources for everyone in supporting
5 relationships that empower individuals to
6 pursue enlightenment and enhance knowledge.

7 Whereas, Director Lang has successfully
8 guided the library through many challenges,
9 including budget -- budget restructuring,
10 building renovations, maintaining outstanding
11 customer service and community relations, and
12 adopted to new -- and adapted new strategies
13 addressing the emerging technology and
14 services in the ever changing roles of
15 libraries in the community.

16 Now, therefore, I, Stephan B. Wilder,
17 Mayor of the City of North Canton, Ohio, do
18 hereby proclaim that the City of North
19 Canton, Ohio recognizes Sandra Lang for her
20 years of service to the North Canton Public
21 Library and to the North Canton community.
22 And we wish her the best in her retirement.
23 Proclaimed this 30th day of April 2020.
24 Congratulations; Sandra Lang.

25 Thank you, Mr. President.

1 MR. FONTE: Congratulations. That's
2 good. Thank you. That's great.
