ORDINANCE 14 - 2021

An ordinance repealing certain Sections of Chapter 505, Animals and Fowl, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of North Canton is considering the adoption of a new Property Maintenance Code that incorporates substantially similar provisions to those contained in the above-referenced Chapter; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to remove any potentially conflicting or redundant provisions from the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton in conjunction with the adoption of a new Property Maintenance Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH CANTON, COUNTY OF STARK, AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the following Sections of Chapter 505, Animals and Fowl, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton, be, and are hereby, repealed in their entirety.

- a. Section 505.10 Nuisance Conditions Prohibited
- b. Section 505.18 Keeping, Harboring, or Permitting of an Excessive Number of Live Chickens Prohibited

Section 2. That the Clerk of Council and Mayor of the City of North Canton be, and are hereby, authorized to make such amendments as may be needed to the Codified Ordinances of the City of North Canton, including, without limitation, such amendments as are necessary to renumber the Sections of Chapter 505 as a result of the passage of this ordinance, to accurately reflect this ordinance upon approval of such amended pages by a voice vote of Council.

Section 3. That if a provision of this ordinance is or becomes illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, it shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this ordinance.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
